E	1] Use Portage Principles within your practice		
E	2] Have at your last OFSTED inspection received a rating of Good or Outstanding		
E	3] Use a broad range of materials (including observational records and developmental profiles/checklists) to provide a framework for parents and carers to discuss their children's		
	individual strengths and needs; supporting 'small steps' to learning in your setting.		
E	4] Review, at least three times a year, plans and goals with parents and carers that promote each child's:		
	a. play and personal development;		
	<ul><li>b. learning, physical development and communication;</li></ul>		
	c. participation and inclusion within the day to day life of the family and the		
	wider community .		
E	5] Keep shared records with the family of their child's progress and other issues raised by		
	them, from regular reviews and setting observations		
E	6] Ensure that at least two of your setting practitioners have successfully completed a		
	Portage Workshop delivered by a trainer accredited with the National Portage Association.		
	(For individual childminders or settings with 3 or less staff, 1 practitioner has completed a
